



Global Emissions by Economic Sector


25% Agriculture, forestry, land-use



Kilograms CO2 equivalent




2. Would you eat local organic food at Xmas to save the planet from global warming?

As you move toward the right in the graph climate impacts decrease and food miles represent a more significant portion of the food's climate impact.


4. Have you changed all your lighting to LEDs?

5. eCards. Marketing gimmick or genuine alternative to traditional greeting cards?



- **‘Adapt’** where we accept that climate change is coming and take measures to reduce its impacts.




Impacts of climate change in Europe

- lower energy consumption.




Total welfare impact under a business-as-usual scenario for 2080s, as a % of GDP (from the EU funded PESETA II project).





A hive of conservation activity. Each year over 60,000 native trees are grown.




Nursery Assistant, Emma Beckinsale, and 8,000 downy willow seedlings. This is comparable to the entire population of the species left in the wild in Scotland.






Direct air capture

Climeworks' rooftop plant : the first direct-air-capture venture in history seeking to sell CO₂ by the ton.

Using machines that resemble jet engines, the Swiss startup extracts CO₂ from thin air.



CCS Scotland could cost-effectively become Europe's carbon capture and storage hub, building on existing pipelines and offshore infrastructure and saving on oil decommissioning costs.
